- ① The Presidents of private universities in Busan, Ulsan, and Kyungnam Province have decided to start offline courses gradually from May 11, 2020.
- ② Under this decision, Dongseo University's Office of Academic Affairs has permitted practice, experiment- or graduation work-relevant courses to be held in classrooms.
